



A film which manages to poke fun at serious things like ideology and war is rare, and certainly not something we associate with Russian Cinema. Director Alexander Rogozhkin sidesteps the usual wartime heroics with a delicious sense of humour which lies in wait 'til the final punchline In the wilderness of the Finnish-Russian border (wistfully shot by Andrei Zhegalov), in the final months of WW2, Veiko has been left to die by the Germans, Ivan, arrested by the Russian secret police, has escaped death by a whisker. Anni, the woman who brings them back to life, is a resourceful Laplander who hasn't seen a man for years. Sexy, saucy and wise, The Cuckoo won Best Film and Best Actor at Moscow International Film Festival, and was snapped up by Sony Classics.



Inspired by the events of that day, they had complete artistic freedom, but were to observe a strict format, a duration of 11 minutes, nine seconds and one frame - or 11'09"01. The artists in this program represent almost every continent and include Danis Tanović, Ken Loach, Alejandro González Iñárritu, Amos Gitaï, Sean Penn and Samira Makhmalbaf. BAADER

AUSTRALIAN PREMIERE Christopher Roth » Germany 2002 (115min)

A prize winner at the 2002 Berlin Film Festival, Christopher Roth's Baader is a vivid, galvanising account of the central figures behind the Baader-Meinhof terrorist activities in Germany in the late 1960s and early 1970s. Baader examines the people involved with this bloody and complex series of events in an extraordinarily energised, thought-provoking way. While writer/director Roth has suggested that his film be viewed as 'a work of pure fiction', its narrative entanglement with the most timely of issues - the politics of terrorism and the morality of politics - render it a searing, provocative social document as well as a gripping filmic thriller. Yee Chih-Yen's second feature is a quiet but significant accomplishment. The story concerns three high-school friends, caught in unrequited, mismatched love - Girl A loves Boy, Boy loves Girl B. Girl B loves Girl A. Yet where most films about teen desire exploit emotional clichés, Yee opts to underplay narrative turns as languid arcs, minor misunderstandings and empty gestures. With winning performances from his predominantly novice cast, the work explores familiar teenage frustration of things that never quite happen, even as momentous life decisions are unfolding. IM

Set in the height of a sweltering, sticky Argentinian summer. La Ciériaga drips with decadence, danger, and decay. First-time feature director Lucrecia Martel maintains a steady tension over the oh-so-slowly collapsing lives of 50 -something alcoholic Mecha, her poor cousin Tali, and their dysfunctional families. All of the characters are stuck, unable to escape the heat or each other. Martel's tightly framed compositions and minimal sound heighten the constant threat of an eruption - a style already drawing comparisons with award-winning British director Lynne Ramsay. The slums of Rio de Janeiro are the setting for Fernando Meirelles' epic chronicle of the growth of gang warfare and the drug trade over a period of two decades. Based on Paulo Lins' best-selling novel, City of God delivers non-stop action, with details of the lives of kids trapped in a never-ending cycle of violence which they accept without question. Unafraid to challenge the viewer, Meirelles puts his exemplary filmmaking skills on display, creating a visually beautiful film that is sophisticated in its understanding of the roots of the social chaos that grip Brazil today. - Toronto Film Festival

Set in East Pakistan (now Bangladesh) in the late 1960s, writer-director Tareque Masud's film tells the story of Anu, a boy whose father, Kazi, has abandoned the sophisticated European-British ways of his own youth to immerse himself in Islam. Kazi is perpetually furious at his wife's brother. an easy-going leftist intellectual, for introducing Anu to sensuous Hindu folk rituals and so sends Anu away for a strict Muslim education. Told with humour, visual flair and a canny sense of narrative, Masud shows great sensitivity for the children's sadness and their ingenuous pluck in the face of life's trials. - Peter Bradshaw The Guardian

Alfred reluctantly plays himself in this making of docu/drama of his own real life story, surrounded by actors playing various roles, including an extraordinarily insensitive writer/director (the real life writer of Here to Where), who throughout the film becomes more obsessed with his own motivations rather than the subject. In this fascinating and ambiguous film, inspired by the work of Abbas Kiarostami, the line between documentary and fiction is never clear.

It is a brilliant and intriguing setting in which the fantasy aspect never dilutes the impact, nor undermines the unexpected humanity of the people involved in this sinister league, including an unbeatably lucky bullfighter and a seemingly indestructible female cop.

A disabled painter leaves Mexico City for the remote countryside in a state of deep depression, intending to commit suicide. He holes up in a tiny village, where an old Indian woman rents him a barn. Gradually the woman's innate humanity and the harsh beauty of the land start to change him. Although sparsely scripted and gently paced, Japón has a lyrical and poetic power that puts it in a different class from most debut features. Full of surprises, its sheer audacity and originality make Japón uncomfortably difficult to forget.

Post-Soviet Lithuania is a state of mind. riddled with contradictions. As seen through the eyes of a 40-something business woman. who would appear to have adapted so well to the new capitalism, director Kristijonas Vildziunas shows his debt to Tarkovsky and Herzog using long silences and shots that extend beyond the action in the frame, seeking to create the atmosphere of her invisible prison. This is the nascent Lithuanian middle class, heither truly Western, nor Communist, unsure of the future and the past. RH

THE MAGDALENE SISTERS

The Magdalene Sisters is the second feature film written and directed by renowned actor Peter Mullan, best known for his performances in Ken Loach's My Name Is Joe and Mike Figgis's Miss Julie. Mullan's potent film is a scathing account of the experiences of a group of young women who find themselves forcibly remanded to life inside an Irish Catholic convent cum sanctuary in 1964. Their stories are heartbreaking yet, sadly, totally believable, and Mullan dissects this world with great sympathy for the girls, barely concealing the icy anger he feels at their plight. - Toronto Film Festival

When M comes to town he is violently robbed. surviving miraculously, but with amnesia. Relying on the kindness of strangers including Salvation Army member, Irma (Kati Outinen), he finds immense personal freedom but is haunted by financial insecurity and threats of detention as an alien. Collaborating with regular cinematographer Timo Salminen, acclaimed auteur Kaurismäki (Drifting Clouds, Leningrad Cowboys) explores the theme of identity through a succession of lovingly composed scenes, splashed with colour and lit like paintings. His witty script, delightful music and inspired cinematic flourishes combine to tell an important story for our times. AB

In the aftermath of the Iran-Iraq war, an ageing Iranian-Kurd musician learns that his ex-wife (a singer with a-magical voice who crossed the frontier 23 years ago) could be in danger in Iraqi Kurdistan. Aiming to find her, he cons his two apathetic sons into accompanying him on an adventurous search through the lawless, war-torn wasteland. Commencing in the vein of an absurd comedy, Kurdish director Ghobadi's film gradually develops into a stirring political portrait of his oppressed people. A complex and disquieting odyssey of music, joy, tragedy and survival.

Using Mike Leigh's improvisational method of film-making, director Annette K. Olesen has created a highly entertaining, accomplished debut feature film, in which the mishaps are hardly minor: death, terminal illness, marriage break-up, and incest. When a man's wife dies in an accident, his children return home to deal with the tragedy together. This wonderful and complex ensemble piece is in turns funny and tragic, delightful and confronting with superb performances throughout.

MORVERN CALLAR

Lynne Ramsay » UK/Canada 2002 (97min) Wed March 5 » 9.45pm » CN2

Morvern Callar confirms Lynne Ramsay's blinding talent and distinctive approach to filmmaking. Her delicate control of sound, look and light creates an evocative, mesmerising view into the . detached world of Morvern Callar. Described by Ramsay as a 'black fairytale', the film begins when the supermarket shelf-stacker, aged 21, wakes up on Christmas morning to find her boyfriend has committed suicide, leaving her with his unpublished novel.






